OPERATION SCEPTRE is a national campaign by Police forces aimed at reducing knife crime, by targeting those carrying weapons and disrupting the supply of knives.

New legislation now makes it illegal to own items including knuckle dusters and zombie knives — even within a private dwelling.

Some young people carry knives because they're worried about becoming a victim of knife crime. But remember - Carrying a knife places you in dangerous situations with a greater risk of serious harm.
