EXPENSES

While unpaid, volunteering shouldn't leave volunteers out of pocket. You can claim expenses for travelling to and from your placement. We will reimburse you for other expenses incurred whilst volunteering, provided it was relevant to the task.

WILL I RECEIVE TRAINING?

As a volunteer you will be given training as appropriate and an induction session so you can learn about Humberside Police and the important role volunteering plays in police work.

REQUIREMENTS

- You must be registered as a UK resident for 3+ years
- You must have 5+ years of checkable history criteria to apply for a role within Humberside in any capacity
- Successful volunteer applicants will undergo a vetting procedure prerequisite of volunteering
- We encourage all volunteers to try to commit to at least 8 hours of volunteering a month
- We will also require at least **two references**
- You must be a minimum of 16 years old - there is no upper age limit

MY COMMUNITY ALERT

My Community Alert is a free messaging system operated by Humberside Police, Humberside Fire & Rescue Service, and Humberside Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner, giving you live information about incidents happening in your area.

Choose how you receive messages, by either phone or email, how often you want to hear from us and about the issues that matter to you.

When something happens that you've told us you want to hear about, your local officer will send you the details, whether that's notice of a road closure due to a collision or a burglar who has been caught in a nearby garden.
